SYNOPSIS


ACT I

Much Ado About Nothing is set in the fictitious Italian city of Messina, where Leonato lives with his daughter, Hero, and her cousin and companion, Beatrice. Leonato receives word from a Messenger that his close friend, Don Pedro has returned from war and plans to visit with some of his fellow soldiers. Among the party is Claudio, who quickly falls in love with Hero. Benedick, a bachelor who has sworn off love and marriage, also comes, and he enjoys speaking his mind in witty arguments with Beatrice. Leonato holds a masked ball to celebrate the end of the war. While at the ball, Don Pedro woos Hero on behalf of Claudio and the engagement of Claudio and Hero is arranged. At the same time, Don Pedro's bastard younger sister, Don John, overwhelmed with bitterness and resentment, seeks a way to spoil the general happiness of the party. Don John plots with her best friend, Borachio and her lover Conrade, to deceive Claudio into believing Hero has cheated on him. Meanwhile, Hero, Claudio, Leonato and Don Pedro decide Benedick and Beatrice are ideal partners, despite their feuding. They make a plot to allow Benedick to overhear them discussing Beatrice's love for him and vice versa. After a series of overheard conversations, Benedick and Beatrice realise they do indeed love one another. Later that night, Hero's maid, Margaret, talks with Borachio from Hero's bedroom window. Don John takes Claudio and the Don Pedro to watch secretly from a distance and think that the girl at the window is Hero. On parole during the night, the local constable, Dogberry, and his side kick, Verges, stumble upon an incriminating conversion between Borachio and Conrade discussing the trick they've played on Claudio and Don Pedro, and arrest them.

ACT 2

At the wedding, Claudio is still deceived into thinking Hero cheated on him. He denounces her and leaves her apparently dead from shock. With the help of the priest, Friar Francis, Leonato, Beatrice, and Benedick decide to pretend that Hero is actually dead until her name can be cleared. With their criminals apprehended, Dogberry and Verges go to the Sexton to interrogate them and have a report written for the nobles. Dogberry's report, after some difficulty, is given to Leonato and Don Pedro. News of Hero's death reaches Claudio and for penance for causing Hero's death, Claudio agrees to marry another of Leonato's "nieces", and visits Hero's tomb to grieve. The next day, everyone gathers to witness the marriage of Claudio to Leonato's "niece", who is revealed to be Hero. The play comes to a joyful conclusion as the lovers are reunited, and Benedick and Beatrice are revealed to the congregation to be in love and announce that they will share the wedding day. Don John has been captured while trying to escape and is left for future trial while the play ends with a merry dance.

Director's Notes

Here we are again, back at the Fairfield Amphitheatre. Working on these Shakespeare productions is consistently one of my biggest highlights each year. From the atmosphere of the space, to the wonderful audiences, to the brilliant actors that I have the privilege of working alongside, it is just an incredible experience every year.

This year's production was a little different for us at GJ Productions from a design aspect, as it is the first of our Shakespeare's that we have based the design off a particular time era, being the late 40s to early 50s. This started off as being just an aesthetic choice, something to base our costuming off, but began to really shape the direction and character choices of the production. It was interesting to look at the play through a particular lens and see the reasons for some of the interactions between characters when defined by a particular time frame. While this production is by no means an exact representation of the world in the wake of World War 2, we feel as a company that the characters in *Much Ado About Nothing* often reflect archetypes from that era; the young man with a dark side after the war, the young lady falling for the dashing soldier; the officer trying to return to some semblance of normality.

Hopefully these influences come through in this production and you can understand where we were trying to come from with this production. Regardless, I'm sure you will enjoy Shakespeare's witty language and our actors' brilliant performances.

Before I leave you to enjoy the show, I would like to thank a few people. First, my wonderful partner Grace Maddern for her incredible work as producer, costume designer, choreographer and performer for this show – you are amazing and I am always blown away by the work you do! Also, Geoffrey Weber, our amazing fight choreographer, for coming in and spending a day making sure that our actors were prepared for this production. And to our Front-of-House staff – Our manager Chris, Geoff and all the wonderful helpers – we couldn't put this show on without you, so thank you so much!

So take a load off, grab a cool drink and some snacks, enjoy the picnic that I'm sure you brought, and enjoy the fun of *Much Ado About Nothing*.






Peter Hatherley


Jennifer Piper


